I Hud 'alaihissalaam was sent to an Arab tribe called 'Aad who were the first to worship idols after the flood.

They had three idols named Samd, Samud, Hara.



© They lived in the desert, in Yemen.

To be exact the tribe of 'Aad lived in the mountains in between Oman and Hadramout near the sea.

Their dwelling place was called Ash Shahr and they lived in a Valley named Mugheeth.

They lived in huge tents with large pillars.

© It is said that Hud 'alaihissalaam was the first man to speak the Arabic language and as mentioned by our Prophet Muhammad sallallaahu 'alaihi wa sallam Hud was one of the four of the Arab Prophets sent by Allaah, the other three being Saalih, Shu'aib and Prophet Muhammad sallallaahu 'alaihi wa sallam.

The people of 'Aad were disbelieving people transgressed against Allaah and were deeply involved in Shirk by worshipping idols. Allaah out of His Mercy sent Hud 'alaihissalaam, a man amongst them, as His Messenger to guide them. Hud 'alaihissalaam called his people to abandon shirk and to worship Allaah alone.

Now what do you think happened next? Yes, it was clear that the people of 'Aad are never going to worship Allaah alone and they were so arrogant that they were asking for their punishment. Do you know how Allaah punished these ungrateful people?

'Aad's Punishment

• The beginning of their punishment was that they started suffering from want of rain, drought and famine.

• The people of 'Aad sought for rain.

• And they saw clouds coming in the sky and thought it was rain bringing relief to them.

• However it was not the case. It was a rain of destruction, punishment and death.

• The people of 'Aad were destroyed by the west wind (Dabur).

• The cold wind lasted for seven nights and eight days and did not leave any person alive from the disbelievers. It is said it started on a Friday and some scholars say it started on a Wednesday.

- The wind followed them everywhere even it entered into the caves of the mountains and destroyed them.
- The wind would come to one of them, carry them, lift them up and then let them fall with their heads downwards.
- When they dropped on the earth, their heads were smashed into pieces and their bodies left with no heads just like the stumps of a fallen palm tree.
- The wind destroyed their palaces, castles and high landmarks.
- They were boasting of their strength and power by saying: "Who is Mightier than us?
- Allaah sent them something that was mightier than their might!

ACTIVITY 4

You can also make your **Try it** ! own Pin wheel or wind mill. **Try it** ! **Make your own wind mill**

Adult supervision required You will need:

- Thin card or thick paper
- I berry pin (sewing pin with a bead top)
- 2 Pencils, one with a rubber top
- Ruler
- Scissors

Directions:

I. Cut out a 20cm x 20cm square out of the card or paper.

2. Lightly draw a line diagonally across the paper from each corner to the opposite (diagonal) corner.

3. Mark the middle of the square (where the two lines cross) and make a small hole. You can use a pencil or the tack to do this.

4. Measure 3cm from the hole along each of the diagonal lines and make a small mark with your pencil.5. Cut along each of the diagonal lines from the outside corners to the mark.

6. Using a pencil or the tack make a hole on the left top corner of each of the four flaps (see diagram above).

7. In turn pick up each flap at the corner with the hole in it, and curl it to the hole in the middle of the square, and thread the pin through the hole, so the head of the tack is on top of the folded flaps.

8. Thread the pin through the middle hole.

9. Push the pin into the rubber on top of the pencil. Be careful not to push the tack too far through the rubber so it sticks out the other side. If it does, gently pull it back through.

You may need to ask an adult to help you this.

10. You have now made your windmill - watch it turn by blowing on it or holding it in the breeze.

To personalise your windmill, colour in the card on both sides with your own design.

Measure the wind

How do we measure wind speed? We use an instrument called

an anemometer to measure wind speed. This is how it looks



Measuring and recording wind speed

The cup anemometer is the simplest type. It consists of four hemispherical cups mounted on the end of four horizontal arms (see picture). The speed at which

the cups rotate is proportional to the speed of the wind. So, by counting the number of turns over a set time, we can work out the average wind speed.
